The Northeast Regional World History Association, in conjunction with the New England American Studies Association, is pleased to announce the following conference:

"GLOBAL NEW ENGLAND: THE MEANING OF REGION IN THE NATION AND THE WORLD"

The conference keynote speaker will be Maggie Favretti, a long-time member of the WHA and former WHA Executive Council member. She teaches both U.S. and world history at Scarsdale High School. She will address the topic of globalizing U.S. history on Friday, April 16 in the late afternoon. Her talk will be followed by a reception open to all WHA, NERWHA, and NEASA members.

The conference is being held in the PEM and includes opportunities to view the collection, including the Yin Yu Tang; the program includes many sessions of interest to world historians, including:

- "American Travelers in Inner Asia: Foreign Devils along the Silk Road"
- "(De)Limiting the Reach of New England in the Nation and the World"
- "Atlantic Worlds: Race and Literary New England"
- "Continuing to Build a Global New England"
- "Salem as Global Community"
- "New England Metropole: Home Port/World Capital"

The Peabody-Essex is the United States' oldest world-history museum and is dedicated to the history of maritime trade and travel beyond the Cape of Good Hope and Cape Horn. The museum is famous for its China-trade artifacts and one-of-a-kind treasures from Oceania. The museum's most recent acquisition is the Yin Yu Tang, a late Qing dynasty merchant-family residence, which offers an intimate glimpse into Chinese daily life.
